whole process can take a while to create, he played some files he created earlier, like a gorilla singing Phil Collin's "In The Air Tonight" and also his niece's dog Ozzy singing "Take Me Out" (by Franz Ferdinand). YouTube has quite a few videos created with this software, and you can create video files in a variety of formats, included mobile phone files and flash video files.

Monday 11th May 2009 - AGM and Epson Scanner

We held our annual general meeting and Francis Jacques was re-elected treasurer, Paul Kuzmin secretary and Tony Hawes the chairman and editor of ROM magazine. The treasurer said that the subscription to the club would remain at £20 but this would not quite sustain us in through the next year. The membership had fallen quite drastically and as the landlords insisted that the charge for our hire of the hall for the night could not be reduced below the existing £36, it was decided that we would miss the January and July meetings as well as the August meeting so that we meet nine times a year. This was proposed by Kevin Kibbey and was seconded by general agreement and a show of hands. With just nine meetings we should be able to cope without raising the subscription. There was also discussion about whether a different venue could be found but this might be more a longer term objective. The University of Surrey was one considered location.

Tony then went on to demonstrate an Epson scanner - not the one that he had hoped to be lent by Epson, but his own Epson Perfection 4990 photo instead. He demonstrated the various masks for transparencies and negatives as well as the very good OCR capability of Abbyy Fine Reader. His laptop was running the first release candidate for Windows 7 and seemed to function perfectly well. We all admired the photo restoration qualities of Epson's software that comes with the scanner, in particular the restoration of badly faded colour transparencies with a pronounced pink cast to near true colours, and all at the click of a mouse, without the intervention of Photoshop or PaintShop Pro was quite amazing.

Monday 8th June 2009 - Improve Your Photo Taking

John Childs presented an interesting evening discussing his photography hobby using Canon cameras and various lenses which he manages to wield without a tripod. All these lenses are zoom lenses apart from a 50 mm traditional fixed lens and he mentioned that fixed lenses are actually more expensive than zoom lenses. He discussed the difference between JPEG for every day use and RAW images for special pictures that can have a lot more processing done in Photoshop or Paint Shop Pro. He also gave a number of useful tips for our summer holidays such as avoiding putting the subject in the middle of the picture and much better to put in one of the outer 1/3 sections. This tends to make the picture look more dynamic. Also if the subject is moving in especially sporting pictures it is a good idea to leave a space in front of the subject to move into which looks much more natural than the subject heading out of frame. In animal shots he generally aimed for the eyes and blurred the background and often crops the picture to focus especially on the animal. He said the blurring the background was very difficult for small cameras to achieve.

Another mistake in photos was not to include a focal point in many landscapes that draws the eye. The timing of pictures was also thought to be essential in landscape pictures with dawn and dusk being the best times. It is also good to give an object of sense of scale in the case of statues and monuments especially. In wildlife scenes it is best to go in as close as possible. He also favoured the use of diagonals such as in a picture of motorbike racing and he showed as some successful panning where the motorbike was in focus and the background was blurred with the motion. He then brought out his spectacular prints which looked incredibly lifelike, my favourite being the otter. I was really impressed with the quality and it is good to see such enthusiasm.

No Meetings in July and August Monday 14th September 2009

Paul Kuzmin showed his 1-TByte Linux Ripserver NAS (Network storage System), Linn Akurate DS (Digital Streamer) and speakers showing how the whole system worked together. Paul explained how this kit has enabled him to archive his entire CD collection, some DVD movies and his pictures.

Monday 12th October 2009

This month's meeting consisted of three items:

- 1. A short practical introduction to some of the new and interesting features of Windows 7 which went on sale 10-days later.
- We then saw three short introductory videos from Corel showing what's new in Corel's new, cheap and easy-to-use Digital Studio 2010 suite of programs.
- 3. Laurence Fenn then gave a practical demonstration of Corel Digital Studio 2010 in action.

Monday 9th November 2009

Two items on show this evening:

- 1. Tony Hawes brought along his laptop with Windows 7 64-bit installed and demonstrated and commented on the features in Windows 7 which appealed to him most: Aero snap to pin items to the sides of your desktop. Aero Peek for temporarily minimising (clearing) the icons on the desktop and Libraries for quick access to documents, pictures, music and videos.
- 2. He then moved on to a demonstration of Nuance PDF Converter Professional 6 in action with his Epson Perfection V700 Photo scanner doing the scanning. He demonstrated the main features of the program which included how to create, convert, edit and share PDF files. At a fraction of the cost of Adobe Acrobat, PDF Converter 6 was shown to be a worthy and cost effective alternative.

Monday 14th December 2009 - Christmas Quiz

Our Christmas Festive meeting on 14th December 2009 consisted as usual of our annual Christmas Quiz. A splendid selection of donated "goodies" was up for grabs (the most expensive being worth over £200

retail). We had joint highest score winners in the shape of Paul Kuzmin and Mike Bray who both managed to score 14 questions right out of 20. Being Christmas we ensured everyone attending the meeting had a warm mince pies and went away with a present!

Monday 8th February 2010 - Gizmos and Gadgets

At the meeting on Monday 8th February of Gizmos and Gadgets we had a demonstration of a variety of items.

- This included the Cygnett FM
 Transmitter, ideal for streaming your
 iPod or MP3 music to your in-car
 stereo to a vacant spot in the FM band.
 Also ideal if you have a mini-DAB
 radio and want to listen to DAB
 stations on your in-car FM stereo.
- 2. Also shown were two Hard-disk enclosures from Sandberg:
- 3. Multi hard Disk Box 3.5" for IDE or SATA 3.5" hard disks c/w PSU.
- 4. Multi Hard Disk Box 2.5" lets you use a 2.5" IDE or SATA hard disk as a portable external hard disk. The box connects to a computer either via USB 2.0 or eSATA, giving transfer speeds of up to 3 GB per second (IDE hard disks cannot, however, be connected with eSATA). Both Boxes come with an adapter bracket to convert an internal SATA port on a desktop's motherboard to an eSATA port. As an added bonus an eSATA cable is supplied with both boxes.
- 5. Doro MemoryPlus was demonstrated to show how a bleeping receiver with keyring can be attached to hard to find keys or whatever. One press of the transmitter and the key-ring receiver bleeps to show its whereabouts — ideal for older folk with short-term memories who may have forgotten where they've put essential items, like keys for example.
- We saw introductory videos from Corel showing the features of their just released latest versions of their popular photo and video editing programs: Corel PaintShop Pro X3 and Video Studio Plus X3.
- We also had a peek as some instructional videos of some other newly released programs.

Overall the February meeting was an interesting and informative evening with a variety of new and fascinating items on show.

Monday 8th March 2010 - Laurence Fenn — Graphical Adventures

First Tony showed us a Ricoh CX2 with built in video. Power DVD 10 out soon 3D compatible - need glasses 3D and a special 3D graphics card.

Laurence's talk followed giving the history of graphical adventure games,

including:

- 1982 Philosopher's Quest on BBC micro and was text based.
- 1980 Mystery House on Apple 2.
- 1978 Atari console Adventure 2D with Easter egg required 4k of memory 128 bytes.
- King's Quest interactive game series from Sierra 1984 - 1998 each improving in graphics eventually 3D we saw a video about the making of KQ6.
- Prince of Persia 1989 2003 Sands of time ongoing realistic movement 3D eventually - Disney releasing a film based on the game in May 2010.
- 1990 Secret of Monkey Island (Lucas Film games) - pick up objects from one side to move to the other side was rereleased in 2009 with speech. Involved character who undergoes trials to become a pirate.
- Another World Delphin software 1991 & 2006 versions on many consoles and DOS - difficult game to win without cheat codes.
- Alone in the Dark 1992-2001 about a detective up to Win 95 - had a movie made that was a flop.
- LucasArts games 1992-93 include Indiana Jones and the Fate of Atlantis, Day of the Tentacle & Sam & Max. We saw a Fate of Atlantis demonstration.
- 1993 Myst Apple Mac 3D background different endings. Riven and further Myst versions.
- The 7th Guest 1st game for PC CD ROM and Mac and Phillips CD-i. Sequel 11th hour 1995 all puzzle games with videos in between, the latter on 4 CDs.
- 1993 Return to Zork a couple of famous actors involved was combining real motion pictures with cartoon animation.
- Under a Killing Moon a Tex Murphy adventure with two sequels, 1994-1998 with famous actors. On up to 6 CDs!
- 1995 Phantasmagoria By Sierra on 7 CDs based on The Shining - banned in Australia! Uses objects picked up to progress through the adventure.
- 1995 Full Throttle by LucasArts cartoon-like game with Mark Hamill
- 1997 The Curse of Monkey Island improved sound interactive cartoon.
- 1998 1st 3D graphics Grim Fandango (I loved that game for its humour and super graphics) was a commercial flop so LucasArts people all left to join different companies.
- 2001 Runaway A Road Adventure. Spanish version detailed 3D graphics.
- 2006 Scratches. Very dark imagery and spooky music very well done but disturbing.
- 2008 A Vampire Story. Ex-LucasArts people as well quite humorous sequel

awaited.

- 2009 Tales of Monkey Island more from Guybrush the hero made for Windows & Wii. It is released in sequels that form episodes.
- 2009 Machinarium large Czech Flash game with a little robot and thought bubbles.
- 2010 The Whispered World about a clown and a pet worm.

He then explained how to play the games on a modern PC. Four ways, firstly, check for Windows updates for games. Some like The 7th Guest, Under a Killing Moon, and 11th Hour have updates that will run the game in Windows instead of DOS. Some games have been released on Great Old Games which have been tweaked to run in Windows and are cheap. Myst: Masterpiece Edition \$5.99, Simon the Sorcerer \$5.99, Phantasmagoria \$9.99

Secondly, Microsoft offer a free download of Virtual PC, which allows you to set up an environment to run the game. MS-DOS 6.2 is currently free from Microsoft as well, or you can use FreeDOS.

Thirdly, If it is a LucasArts game, Simon the Sorcerer 1 & 2, Return to Zork, The 7th Guest, King's Quest 1-4, Goblins 1-3, Disc World, Space Quest 1-3, Flight of the Amazon Queen, Beneath a Steel Sky then ScummVM is a program that will run the game using its own code, so it can run a game. Versions for Mac and Pocket PC available as well.

Lastly, Any other game can be run using DOSBox 0.73. A free download that sets up an environment with virtual drives that can be mapped to any folder. If ISO images are made of the CDs needed, these can be mount so you don't need any of them when you play the game. The CD can be changed with a keystroke. It can be quite complex to set up, so there are front ends to DOS Box that help you set up the game.

3D TV is Coming!

Panasonic, Samsung, Sony and Toshiba are preparing to launch by the summer to coincide with the release of more 3D films and the release of Sky 3D broadcasts. Its rumoured pricing will range between £2000 - £3000 depending on the technology used and all of the models will require special glasses.

What is 3DTV?

3DTV is a display technology which creates the illusion of a third dimension, allowing viewers to enjoy high quality, high definition three-dimensional movies, television programs and video games in the comfort of their own homes.

How does it work?

There are three different formats of 3DTV, however all formats basically work in the way. Two separate images are broadcast simultaneously of the same scene, with one image slightly to the side of the other. When viewed with special 3D glasses the viewer will perceive that these two images are one single 3D image.

3DTV FORMATS

Auto StereoScopic 3D

This form of 3DTV can be watched without special glasses, however you need to sit or stand directly opposite the TV. This type of TV is already available; however it is only really suitable for commercial use such as a shop display.

Passive 3D

Anaglyph (Colour filtered) glasses

Passive 3D TV is already in existence and can be viewed through a normal TV using a pair of anaglyph (colour filtered) glasses which are relatively cheap. Channel 4 showed a series of 3D films at Christmas 2009 that needed coloured filtered glasses (that were given out free by Sainsburys). Colour is generally very poor and image ghosting is a real

problem.

Polarised (Angle filtered) glasses

The other type of Passive TV requires Polarised (Angle filtered) glasses. This technology is currently employed in cinemas showing films in 3D and will be used by Sky in TV broadcasts which will begin later this year. Image quality is a lot better, although some ghosting still exists.

Active 3D

Active 3DTV offers the best quality experience for the viewer, although the LCD Shutter Glasses required to view it are likely to be relatively expensive, especially if you buy each member of the family a pair. As this technology requires the glasses to be synchronized with the refresh rate of the screen, you will need a wireless dongle or wired glasses to sync with the TV.

When will 3DTVs be available to buy?

A number of big TV manufacturers including Samsung, Sony, LG and Panasonic will be launching 3DTV products into the UK market this year, with the first products

expected to hit the shops in April.

Will I be able to buy 3D Bluray and DVD discs?

The next development is **3D Blu-ray** players which will play new **3D Blu-ray** content, and certain manufacturers will be launching Blu-ray players that can upscale standard 2D into 3D! It's expected that Panasonic, Samsung, Sony and Toshiba will launch their 3D Blu-ray players midlate 2010, with Sony and Samsung also launching Home Cinema Systems complete with 3D Blu-ray players. Sony, Disney and Dreamworks all have plans to release 3D Blu-ray movies this year; however titles will be limited in the early days.

When will they start to broadcast 3D programmes?

Sky launched Europe's first 3D television channel with coverage of the Premier League match between Manchester United and Chelsea on 3rd April. Sky 3D will show at least five more Premier League games live in the UK before the end of the season, as well as the Football League playoff finals at the end of May.

Although relatively few members of the public have bought 3D TVs so far, BSkyB

revealed that more than 1,000 pubs and clubs across the UK and Ireland have signed up for the service.

"It's fitting that one of the biggest games of the season will be the launch pad for our pioneering Sky 3D service," said Brian Lenz of Sky. "With 3D, seeing really is believing, so it's great news that over 1,000 pubs across country will be able to show the magic of 3D to their customers."

Sky 3D plans to add other sports programming as well as films, documentaries, entertainment and arts programmes later in the year.

The channel will be introduced at no extra cost for subscribers to Sky's top channels and HD pack.

In January, Sky became the first broadcaster in Europe to air a 3D sporting event by carrying Manchester United's 3-1 win at Arsenal in nine pubs across London, Manchester, Cardiff, Edinburgh and Dublin.

Broadcasts to home will come later in the year and will require a Sky+HD box as well as a 3DTV.

Late PS. As BBC and ITV hold the UK rights to broadcast June 2010 World Cup matches in the UK, there will be no Sky 3D broadcasts of matches in 3D.





Uniblue SpeedUpMyPC 2010

SpeedUpMyPC by Uniblue

First launched in 2003, SpeedUpMyPC has provided a lifeline to countless PC users who have been frustrated by slow start-up and program opening times, frequent freezes and crashes and a general deterioration in computer performance. The software optimizes system settings, deletes junk files and improves RAM and CPU function, injecting a new lease of life into a PC therefore reducing the need for expensive hardware updates. After a system scan to identify files, processes and settings that cause data bottlenecks and slowdowns, SpeedUpMyPC undertakes a series of targeted tweaks to boost system resource management, to optimize system and network settings and to remove junk files that can

In Use

My review copy was supplied as a downloadable copy with an activation serial number. Download was 5Mb in size and all that was necessary was to save the download, run the .exe file, key in the serial number and that was it.

The initial screen has four self explanatory tabs: Overview, Speed Scan, Manage and Settings (see below)..




Figure 4: Having done a scan from the Overview screen SpeedUpMyPC shows suggested improvements. In my case 9 System Tweaks (Fig. 5) and removal of 3687 redundant files. (Fig. 6) below.

Clicking the Start Scan button in the Overview screen, it scans and suggests possible improvements (see Fig. 4 below).

Having implemented the fixes suggested by SpeedUpMyPC 2010, my PC appeared to run that much quicker, but this is my subjective impression because I have a newish and powerful computer, which means I'm not likely to notice any measurable slow-down in my PC's processes. However, if you have a computer that hasn't had a spring clean for a while, SpeedUpMyPC simply and easily removes accumulated detritus that *can* slow down your PC.

Free Trial

If you are not sure you whether you really need want to purchase SpeedUpMyPC 2010 a free downloadable trial version is available. If you've had your computer for a while it's almost certainly running slower

than it should, in which case Uniblue SpeedUpMyPC 2010 will clean up your PC, optimise its performance and have it operating like new once again, which isn't too bad an idea.

Conclusions

Simple and easy to use, cheap, and if you are worried about security Uniblue is a Microsoft Gold Certified Partner. It includes a 3-PC, 1-Year licence.




Figure 6: ScanMyPC 2010 recommends removing 3687 files hogging my PC's system resources.

Ricoh CX2 Digital Compact Camera

Reviewed by John Childs ARPS, CPAGB.

Introduction

This is a compact camera with some interesting aspects. It is not as compact as some I have handled but it is still compact enough to slip into a pocket. It comes in black, silver or a fetching two-tone effect and it feels sturdy, well made and is fairly heavy. Alas, it has no optical viewfinder and so the rear screen must be used instead. I personally regret the passing of optical viewfinders and can never get used to holding a camera at arms length in order to view a scene. The screen is 3 inches in size across the diagonal and is of very good quality. The sensor contains just over 9 million pixels. The zoom lens is the equivalent of 28mm to 300 mm on a 35mm camera. This is a very wide range and should cover almost any shooting situation. The max. aperture is F3.5 at the wide angle end and F5.6 at the telephoto end of the lens. I once reviewed a Kodak compact camera which had an extended range to its zoom lens and at the extreme telephoto range I was unable to obtain a sharp image as the camera could not be held steady enough. In the case of the Ricoh camera it has image stabilization build in and this is a great help in keeping the sensor steady whilst taking a

The rate at which the camera can shoot pictures in quick succession is very good indeed at 5 frames per second at the full 9 meg. resolution for up to 15 shots.

This is not a camera for the enthusiast, as neither the aperture nor the shutter speed can be set manually. However, this is made up for slightly by the camera having loads of modes which can be engaged for various types of photography. There are many, many more things that can be tweaked or selected, so much so that the handbook runs to 244 pages! However, I suspect that the sort of person who would buy this camera would not be too concerned about using more than a fraction of the facilities provided

The review sample takes SD and SDHC memory cards. As my own cameras take Compact Flash cards, I have no SD cards and none were provided with the camera. However, there is an 88MB internal memory and that was sufficient for me to take enough pictures (not all at the same time!) to see what the camera could do.

As well as the facility to take still images, the camera has the ability to take video sequences.

The predecessor of the CX2, the CX1, was released only about six months ago, and the specification of the CX2 is slightly superior. Those who bought a CX1 so recently have every reason to be aggrieved!



In Practice

The camera came with a suite of programs for both Windows and Apple Mac computers. However, the camera produces only JPEGs (in the sRGB colour space) so I was able to load them directly into my copy of Photoshop CS2 and I used this throughout and I did not investigate how well the provided programs performed.

An interesting feature is the ability of the camera to take two images in quick succession at different exposures and then combine then incamera using the correctly exposed parts of both images. This sort of thing can be done with other cameras by taking two or more images at different exposures in quick succession and then merging the correctly exposed parts of them in an image editing program. The way the Ricoh does it is much more convenient. However, it must be said that

because two images are taken one after the other, it is quite possible to end up with blurred images if the subject is moving quickly enough. The dynamic range of digital camera sensors is not as great as is often necessary and it is so easy to burn out the highlights of a picture so that no detail remains. For example, one of the problems encountered by wedding photographers is the huge contrast between the white of the bride's dress and the black of the groom's suit. Many professional photographers do not get the exposure right and I have seen the results when they try to obtain an RPS distinction and fail because there is no detail in the brides dresses in the images they submit. I can therefore see a need for this facility, as provided in the Ricoh camera, to spread to high end DSLR cameras in the fullness of time.

Another interesting feature is the ability of the camera to shoot while the shutter button is pressed, but only the last 15 frames are recorded to create a single multi-picture file.

I could go on and on about all the facilities this camera has, but the important thing is the





quality of the images it takes.

These are two pictures I took with the Ricoh (above). I am very impressed with the colour fidelity if not with the overall sharpness of the images when printed at the full pixel count at A4 size. The pictures as shown in this review do not do justice to the actual images as taken with the camera because I have had to reduce the pixel count when importing them since this review will form part of ROM which will appear on the Web.

Conclusion

As I finished this review the CX 2 was replaced by the CX3. The CX1 and the CX2

only appear to have been on the market for around six months each. This seems a phenomenal rate of obsolescence and I wonder how long the CX3 will last. Whilst, of course, each version does not stop taking pictures when it is replaced it must be galling for owners to think that their camera is no longer current so soon after purchase.

This is not a camera I could live with, as there is no optical viewfinder. The images suffer, in my view, from having been produced at a high pixel count from a very small sensor. So long as you do not enlarge them too much, then they will pass muster. I do think that too many facilities have been shoehorned into the camera: an instruction book of 244 pages seems rather excessive, but is needed to cover all the facilities the camera has to offer.

Pricing and Availability

The CX2 is in stock online at Simply Electronics fo £209.95 inc VAT and free delivery, whilst its successor, the Ricoh CX3, is available from a variety of dealers for around £299 or thereabouts.

from is vast and I sometimes wonder how people make a rational choice from the extensive range available. Obvious competitors

In Use

Paragon Hard Disk Manager 2010 follows on from its predecessor the 2009 version, but with improvements, in particular it's now certified for use with Windows 7.

I installed the Professional version which has all the tools that the lower priced (and lower specified) 'Suite' version has. The Professional differs from the basic Suite version in that it adds the ability to work with Dynamic Disks, a feature that is likely be of more interest to high-end corporate and business Windows users than the personal consumer at home and SOHO users.

Although my screen grabs alongside show "Professional;" the versions are otherwise identical.

There's not too much to say about the program apart from the fact that I'm very impressed with its tools and capabilities, so prefer to show what it can do with the screen-grabs alongside.

Paragon Hard Disk Manager 2010 copes with tasks I asked it to do such as when I want to copy a disk partition from one physical disk to another, resize partitions, or prepare disks for otherwise difficult multiboot Windows installations. As a bonus it also backs up and restores anything from complete hard disks to the contents of any set of files you specify; and can wipe data from partitions or whole drives, and copies hard disks to disk images that can boot in VMware Workstation or Microsoft Virtual PC. Its like a computer version of a very essential Swiss Army Penknife, except it won't remove stones from horses hooves!

Conclusions

Although Windows has its own hard drive management tools, they are relatively basic, but if you are a computer enthusiast who wants more or higher quality partitioning, defragmenting and disaster recovery tools, Paragon Hard Disk Manager 2010 Suite could be the tool you want — recommended.



Nero Multimedia Suite 10 Reviewed by Laurence Fenn

I was a bit wary of installing Nero 10 on my laptop as its predecessor Nero 9 took several hours to install and had many bugs. The complete suite certainly installed quicker but with a few quirks. To start with, two required additions to my up-to-date Windows 7 system were needed, Microsoft VC Redist 2005 KB973544 (Microsoft Visual C++ 2005 Service Pack 1 Redistributable Package ATL Security Update) and Microsoft VC Redist 2008 KB973552 (Microsoft Visual C++ 2008 Service Pack 1 Redistributable Package ATL Security Update). It also installs a Reboot Validator whatever that is and gives you an option to install a Nero Ask Bar. I then had to reboot my PC for these to take effect. I found this a bit annoying as I haven't installed any of the Nero software and I'm rebooting my

Features Available

After the restart and entering the serial number, I got the choice of what elements to install. These include:

That's a total of 2219.5MB but the installation won't tell you that. You then have two tick boxes, one for shortcuts and one for the Multimedia Suite to manage the files. If you don't want the icons to change for your existing files and control to be taken away from your existing programs, you should tick yes for the shortcuts but no to the second. The installation then runs each of the installs for the elements you selected. If you chose all of them then that is 39 separate installations, which took about 20 minutes. You don't get any prompts but surely they could have had just one progress bar and one installation rather than dividing it into 39 chunks.

Right after it finishes the program runs Nero ControlCenter to check for updates. The guide recommends this, but when you click on check for updates, you get a message "ERROR IN YOUR INSTALATION. An Error occurred. Please restart Nero Control Center and try again." After an email to technical support I found out that as the software hadn't been officially re-

leased yet, the update server was not reporting the right message. I hope this is corrected as it is not good to have an error message when updating the software and you haven't even used it yet. The ControlCenter does not link to any help files; instead when you click on help you get a message that manuals and help files are not included in this version. This is despite the 211 help files installed, including 14 different languages for each application. Nero has always had this policy of not including help in their programs to reduce the size of the download. Every other software manufacturer includes help files when you install the software. Is there going be a situation where you want to update the help without fixing a bug in the program? I doubt it, but as this suite did include the help files (48MB of them) it would be nice that all the programs had them or linked to them. I'm sure installers can check what language the operating system is using so there is no need to install 14 different language help files.

Nero MediaHub

The new MediaHub component is a combined media organizer, media player, photo editor and slideshow creator. Once the directories to watch are set you can import music, video and photos. When viewing photos you can use an inbuilt editor to correct red eye, colour, etc. and some other effects. You have a large variety of controls to tweak your photos, with an undo for each action. Not as good as a dedicated photo editor, but certainly useable. You can also create a slideshow using one of several themes, which are saved for later viewing. There are no editors for the music and video clips even though Nero Vision and Nero WaveEditor are included in the suite.

You can publish your media by burning it to CD, DVD or Blu-ray. You can upload your media directly to My Nero, YouTube, MySpace, Flickr or Facebook. Just enter your login details and approve Nero as a client and the program will upload your video, pictures or music.

Nero Vision

Nero Vision has been updated with more tracks and easier tools. Video can be imported from many different formats including vob files, which can be scanned for separate segments and divided accordingly. Smart encoding is now included which saves time if the files were rendered in the DVD format beforehand. Smart Rendering has been available in Corel's VideoStudio and DVD MovieFactory for some time and it helps reduce the time it takes to produce your discs, so it is a welcome addition. The themes for the menus are very good, but parts of the program interface still look like the old version which does not seem to be in line with the rest of the redesign.

Nero Burning ROM has a new DiscSpan job which lets you use different disc types. The last disc burnt will include an application to restore the archive so you don't need to have Nero installed. There is a new Burn Now button which bypasses the options dialog you usually get when opening a project. There's now support for AVCHD, a new high definition video format used in camcorders and SecurDisc 2.0 technology helps to prevent scratches and disc deterioration from rendering your data unreadable. In Windows 7 the application can be minimised and a progress update viewed by hovering your cursor over the toolbar icon.

Nero BackItUp & Burn

Nero BackItUp & Burn asks for a destination drive with enough space to perform the backups, and then automatically sets up everything else to ensure your data is regularly saved. Automatic back up is performed every two hours by default, but this can be changed to when the computer is idle or boots up. You can also schedule a backup on a particular date and time.

Conclusions

Overall there are plenty of applications, but it still feels like a mismatch of designs as some applications have not been given the complete makeover.

The MediaHub is a convenient program that seems to duplicate Windows 7 MediaCentre with a few extra features but is the best addition to the suite.




Figure 1 - Nero MediaHub




Figure 3 - Nero BackItUp & Burn
