Editor's Bit

Well Christmas has been and gone and we are now well into the New Year — so what's really new?

Vista — One Year On

Firstly, Vista is now a year old and it's worth recording that even now there are varying views as to whether Vista is a good or bad thing. As I've said at our monthly meetings my own experience of Vista is positive and I don't think I would ever envisage going back to XP — although to be on the safe side I keep a spare drive for my notebook loaded with XP just in case!

Vista is not the disaster some people make it out to be, but given the time it took to ship, one really expected more from Microsoft when they launched Vista on 30th January 2007 after a lengthy five-years' gestation — even an elephant doesn't need that long to get it right!

Unfortunately Vista is still affected by many of the foibles that were present in XP and ME (and earlier) versions of Windows. It's still necessary to wait through prolonged program installs and uninstalls and hope against hope that it doesn't go tits-up in the process and all the time praying that you don't have to invoke the ancient DOS 'Regedit' command to fix some deep-seated registry system ailment. Vista is a better Windows — or at least is on its way to becoming one.

With the imminent launch of Vista SP1 some parts of Vista will be improved. If you look at the ads for new PCs with all their installed bells and whistles of more storage, faster processors and new graphics cards most of the complaints about Vista's performance issues will fade away. However, at the end of the day Vista is still Windows, but personally, with a year's experience under my belt, albeit with a fairly powerful PC, I have no complaints and will not return to XP.

Vista SP1

When you come to read this Vista SP1 will be imminent — the rumour mill is that 27th February is the official day of release.

Microsoft says the goal of Windows Vista SP1 is to address key feedback Microsoft has received from its customers without regressing application compatibility. Windows Vista SP1 will deliver improvements and enhancements to existing features that significantly impact customers, but it does not deliver substantial new operating system features. For example, the service pack improves the performance of the desktop shell, but does not include a new version of Windows Media Center.

The updates in Windows Vista SP1 fall into three categories, which the following sections describe in detail:

1. Quality improvements, including all previously released updates, which address reliability, security,

Film & Transparency Scanning with Plustek

Over the years most keen photographers will have accumulated a collection of 35-mm transparencies and 35-mm negative strips which contain irreplaceable family memories that many would like to transfer to a digital format. One way of doing this is by scanning your slides and negatives using a flat-bed scanner, or alternatively by using a dedicated transparency and negative film-strip scanner. So tonight we'll be looking at a Plustek's new high-end OpticFilm 7500i Film Scanner, comparing its performance with an Epson flat-bed scanner that also scans transparencies and film strips.

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and performance.

- Improvements to the administration experience, including BitLocker Drive Encryption (BDE).
- Support for emerging hardware and standards, such as an Extensible Firmware Interface (EFI) and an Extended File Allocation Table (exFAT).

Quality Improvements

Quality improvements have the broadest impact on all customers. It is the foundation of Windows Vista SP1 and is about improving the overall Windows Vista experience.

First, Windows Vista SP1 will include all previously released updates for Windows Vista. It also will include security, reliability, and performance improvements. These improvements target some of the issues Microsoft has identified as the most common causes of operating system crashes and hangs, giving customers a more reliable experience. These updates also improve performance in key scenarios-for example, when copying files or shutting down the computer.

Security

Security improvements in Windows Vista SP1 include:

- Provides security software vendors a more secure way to communicate with Windows Security Center.
- Includes application programming interfaces (APIs) by which third-party security and malicious software detection applications can work with kernel patch protection on x64 versions of Windows Vista. These APIs help ISVs develop software that extends the functionality of the Windows kernel on x64 computers without disabling or weakening the protection offered by kernel patch protection.
- Improves the security of running RemoteApp programs and desktops by allowing Remote Desktop Protocol (RDP) files to be signed. Customers can differentiate user experiences based on publisher identity.
- Adds an Elliptical Curve Cryptography (ECC) pseudo-random number generator (PRNG) to the list of available PRNGs in Windows Vista.
- Enhances BitLocker Drive Encryption (BDE) to offer an additional multifactor authentication method that combines a key protected by the Trusted Platform Module (TPM) with a Start-up key stored on a USB storage device and a user-generated personal identification number (PIN).

Reliability

Improvements will target some of the most common causes of crashes and hangs, giving users a more consistent experience. Many of these improvements will specifically address issues identified from the Windows Error Reporting tool. The following list describes some of the reliability improvements that Windows Vista SP1 will include:

- Improved reliability and compatibility of Windows Vista when used with newer graphics cards in several specific scenarios and configurations.
- Improved reliability when working with external displays on a laptop.
- Improved Windows Vista reliability in networking configuration scenarios.
- Improved reliability of systems that were upgraded from Windows XP to Windows Vista.
- Increased compatibility with many printer drivers.
- Increased reliability and performance of Windows Vista when entering sleep and resuming from sleep.

Performance

Performance improvements that Windows Vista SP1 include:

- Improves the speed of copying and extracting files.
- Improves the time to become active from Hibernate and Resume modes.
- Improves the performance of domain-joined PCs when operating off the domain; in the current release version of Windows Vista, users would experience long delays when opening the File dialog box.
- Improves performance of Windows Internet Explorer 7 in Windows Vista, reducing CPU utilization and speeding JavaScript parsing.
- Improves battery life by reducing CPU utilization by not redrawing the screen as frequently, on certain computers.
- Improves the logon experience by removing the occasional 10-second delay between pressing CTRL-ALT-DEL and the password prompt displaying.
- Addresses an issue in the current version of Windows Vista that makes browsing network file shares consume significant bandwidth and not perform as fast as expected.

Administration Experience

There are improvements to the deployment, management, and functions for Windows Vista customers. These enhancements include:

- BitLocker Drive Encryption encrypts extra local volumes. For example, instead of encrypting only drive C, customers can also encrypt drive D, E, and so on
- Addresses problems with printing to local printers from a Windows Terminal Services session.
- The Network Diagnostics tool will help customers solve the most common file sharing problems, in addition to the basic problems that it already diagnoses
- Administrators can control the volumes on which to run Disk Defragmenter.

In addition to these changes, Windows Vista SP1 will change the tools that customers use to manage Group Policy. Administrators requested features in Group Policy that simplify policy management. To do this, the service pack will uninstall the Group Policy Management Console (GPMC) and GPEdit.msc will edit local Group Policy by default. In the SP1 time-frame, administrators can download an out-of-band release that will give them the ability to add comments

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to Group Policy Objects (GPOs) or individual settings and search for specific settings.

Secretary's Notes

10th December 2007 Meeting — Annual Christmas Quiz. The Christmas quiz was once again a big success with a good turnout. Congratulations to Ric Evans who got the most questions right and had 1st choice of the many prizes on offer.

14th January 2008 Meeting — Windows Movie Maker. At our first meeting of the New Year on 14th January we had a practical demonstration of how to use Windows Movie Maker, a free application that comes as part of Microsoft's Windows XP and Windows Vista operating systems. The demo on a 64-bit Notebook used the latest Windows Vista version of Movie Maker, but there is not too much difference between this and the version that comes with Windows XP (SP2).

Windows Movie Maker introduced an easy and intuitive new interface to help users turn their video memories into winning videos. The improved effects and multiple transition options in Windows Movie Maker, together with the high-end graphics power of today's PCs, can help turn just about anyone into a movie director.

With his JVC Camcorder connected to the computer via the Firewire port your Editor showed how easy it is using Windows Movie Maker to import video from a Camcorder, to Edit and trim video footage, add Music and narrations, create titles and end credits etc.

Having opened Windows Movie Maker, selected "Create a new project" and downloaded the footage to be demonstrated, we were shown how the unedited clips could be dragged to the Storyboard for editing. Next we were shown how to use the Timeline to edit these clips by trimming (cutting) unwanted footage and how to 'split' clips into two or more sections to make for easier editing. We were then shown a selection of the various transitions that could be inserted between clips to make for smooth scene changes. Our Editor also gave advice as to what to what transitions to avoid and what to use if one wants to wind up with a

'professional-looking' edited video. Following this we were shown how to select and add still photos into the Storyboard as part of the edited video, how to create and add titles, add music to the audio tracks and 'stretching' the audio tracks to fit and match the video footage

Finally we saw a six-minute edited home video created with Windows Movie Maker which was ready for burning to DVD using Windows DVD Maker. Windows DVD Maker is only available in Windows Vista Home Premium and Windows Vista Ultimate, (not with Windows XP). With it the user can create professional-looking video DVDs that can be viewed on home DVD players as well as on a PC and regardless of geographical region codes.

Although Windows Movie Maker doesn't have all the bells and whistles of 'full' consumer video editing programs, for those on a tight budget or just wanting to experiment with video editing, Microsoft Movie Maker is surprisingly capable (and free) when it comes to editing your Camcorder home video footage.

Steganos Internet Security 2008 Reviewed by Tony Hawes


According to Steganos's publicity, Steganos Internet Security 2008 offers fast and comprehensive, value-for-money protection against viruses, hackers, spyware, spam and online threats.

The integrated AntiSpyware application recognises spyware and adware. Potentially unwanted programs, adware, Trojans, worms and keyloggers are all detected using the latest analysis techniques. The integrated firewall controls the network connections and blocks attacks from hackers or Trojans. The resident protection deactivates viruses by supervising the copying, opening and storage of files. As soon as a virus is discovered, Steganos AntiVirus 2008 stops the current process and stops the virus from activating. Automatic virus removal eliminates or disinfects virus-infected files and other threats such as Trojans or worms.

The email scanner examines incoming and outgoing emails and is compatible with all SMTP/POP3 based email clients, including Microsoft Outlook, Outlook Express and Eudora. The email scanner is compatible with encrypted connections that use SSL.

Steganos's technology uses a combination of virus scan, heuristic matching and generic detection to ensure that no virus goes undiscovered. Suspicious files are quarantined to prevent an infection and the virus data bank is regularly updated to ensure that the software can always detect the latest threats.

There are two user modes: the basic mode offers maximum protection for mini-



mal work and the professional mode provides maximum flexibility for more advanced users who would like to configure as much as they can themselves. The intelligent scan function in Steganos AntiVirus 2008 can be used to determine which data should be permitted or blocked, so that users can compile their own black list and white list.

Both Steganos AntiVirus 2008 and Steganos Internet Security 2008 include a year of automatic updates to ensure that the software is always up to date. If a new version of the software is released within that year, users can update to the next version of the software for free.

The review copy came as a downloadable file from the Steganos web site which I saved to my HD.

Installation

My routine before installing new review software is to create a System Restore point so that should anything go wrong I can quickly revert the computer back to its original configuration, so having done this I went ahead and installed the program. The install routine also checked and suggested that my current AntiVirus and Firewall application should be replaced by theirs — which I agreed to.

In Use

Once installed it went online to update the virus definitions/signatures and then suggested I do a full scan of my computer, again I said yes, and let it get on with the job.

Surprisingly, because I knew from previous scans with competitor's Security Suites that my computer was reported as 'clean', Steganos flagged up a number of files that it identified as infected and moved to the Virus Vault. Intrigued I investigated further and they were rather ancient downloads with an .rar extension that I had not to my knowledge opened or run. It could be that Steganos examined and identified a Virus/Trojan within the .rar archive that other AV programs had failed to detect.

After this, updated definitions are downloaded daily, with no apparent impact on speed or performance with updates being done in the background, should you wish it's possible to download updates at your convenience.

File Scanning

Steganos Anti-virus (AV) and Spyware detection scans files on access and on demand,

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the latter is useful if you want to check a particular source such as a CD etc for infected files.

Anti-Virus Routine Scans

To maintain a good AV routine, scans can be scheduled to run daily, weekly, or monthly. Incoming and outgoing e-mails are scanned automatically for viruses just in case something nasty has targeted you without your knowledge.

Trojan.

As a test I have a known and nasty Trojan on a CD that I always put into my CD drive to see whether a security / anti-virus program identifies it. Steganos Internet Security 2008 identified it immediately, see screen shots.

The AntiVirus element of the previous (2007 version) of Steganos's Suite was based on Kaspersky's Personal Edition AntiVirus. Having heard that Steganos had a new AV engine supplier for their 2008 version I was interested to know who was behind it. This was quickly resolved as during installation it loaded a variety of

AVG .dll's, which together with icons on the Taskbar as security scans took place, clearly indicated that the 2008 version is now based on Grisoft's very highly respected AVG AntiVirus program (see screenshots below).

Conclusion

Steganos Internet Security 2008 seems to do all that's necessary to keep your computer and its contents secure and away from prying eyes. The interface is logical and easy to use. Unlike its rivals that come with a 3-user licence such as Symantec Norton Internet Security Suite 2008, McAfee's Total Protection 2008 and F-Secure Internet Security Suite 2008, Steganos Security Suite 2008 comes with but a single licence, which seems a bit mean. However, its price is considerably less than either of its main rivals, so its a case of what you gain on the swings you loose on the roundabouts.



Plustek Upgrades its Film Scanner Range — Plustek OpticFilm 7500i Al Review by Tony Hawes

Plustek upgrades its top-end film scanner range with the launch of the OpticFilm 7500i AI and SE, the first Plustek Mac compatible scanners.

Background

The OpticFilm 7500i AI and 7500i SE, high-resolution film scanners are dedicated to the scanning of 35mm slides and negatives and offer a high optical 7,200dpi resolution featuring multi-exposure function for negative film as well as a multi-sampling feature that reduces noise. Each model comes with specialist software to further enhance the scan quality and speed. The OpticFilm 7500i AI and 7500i SE are priced at £395 and £223 excluding VAT, respectively.

The scanners are ideal for digital imaging enthusiasts, photographers, and home office users for tasks such as enlarging photographs, converting slides into high-quality images for magazines and other printed material, digitising collections of slides to create digital libraries, as well as posting and sharing images on the internet.

The OpticFilm 7500i SE includes a new multi-exposure scanning function for negative film. Producing a high quality, detailed scan, multi-exposure accentuates fine details found in highlights and shadows, such as reflections and textured surfaces and also helps to eliminate noise.

The OpticFilm 7500i AI comes with a SilverFast 35mm IT8 Target calibration slide, which can generate ICC profiles enabling the scanner to be calibrated using a standard colour target. SilverFast also generates its own internal calibration, enhancing colour accuracy.

The multi-sampling function on both scanners enhances scan quality by minimising noise found in the image caused by varying factors such as low-level lighting or low resolution images. In operation, the unit quickly scans the slide four times with each scan generating four separate readings of the noise level on the image. These are then automatically averaged out to produce the final high-quality scan.

Providing a 48-bit scanning capability, both scanners support recognition of literally trillions of different colours. The result is a highly accurate colour repetition when compared to the original with even subtle details such as shadows and highlights being picked-up.

Two film holders are also provided for mounting slides and filmstrips.



The initial scan screen. Clicking the icons along the top gives access to various parameters such as histogram, colours, shadow and mid-tone effects etc.

Other scan options can be selected from the menu including the scan dpi with the slider at the bottom.



With the pre-scan done the prescanned image is shown. Along the left are a series of icons which when clicked give access to further options to be used during the final scan. As an example the iSRD dust and scratch removal tool has been selected. Many other options are available.

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• Plustek Quickscan

The scanners run on Windows 2000, XP or XP 64bit, Vista and MacOS 10.3.9 or later.

In Use — Plustek OpticFilm 7500i Al

The driver software and SilverFast AiStudio 6.5 come on two CDs. There is no manual however there are three

multi-lingual printed "Quick Guides": A Read Me First guide for the unpacking, connection and software installation, A 'SilverFast AiStudio' quick guide and a 'Scanner Buttons' quick guide. Full documentation is on the CDs.

Unlike most hardware installations where the software is installed before connecting the scanner, Plustek asks for the scanner to be plugged in to the USB port first, with the software installation following.

Having powered up the scanner and plugged the USB cable into the computer it installed the driver software and the optional NewSoft Presto! and Presto Folio Image management software. Following this the SilverFast software install options are given; to install either the SilverFast PhotoShop / Stand Alone plug-in and / or the SilverFast TWAIN plug-in for Windows.

With the software installed and after a reboot it was time to explore the capabilities of the scanner.

With transparencies in the slide holder it was only necessary to press a button on the front to open the SilverFast menu. As can be seen from the screen grabs on page 5 there are two windows:

- 1. The initial screen where a Prescan and Final Scan can be invoked.
- 2. After a Prescan the second window shows the scanned slide with SilverFast processing options in the form of mini icons on the left-hand side. Clicking on

these icons fine-tunes the final scan to one's requirements.

Scan Features

Multiple sampling. For most users the most important feature is the capability of being able to automatically remove digital 'noise', blemishes and dust. To minimize noise, the Plustek 7500i has a multiple sampling function that makes four scans during scan time, since the noise patterns changes each scans, the image is averaged together and noise cancel out if inconsistencies are present.

iSRD. iSRD stands for Infrared Smart Removal of Defect, which is a combination hardware and software solution to automatically eliminate minor flaws, such as dust and scratches, using infrared channels.

Two modes, automatic and manual, are available. In automatic mode, SilverFast iSRD operates completely on its own and applies the corrected result to the entire scan frame. In manual mode, the user can select certain areas to work on, and leave the rest untouched.

With defects removed, SilverFast iSRD does not soften or blur the scanned file and it provides the user with an enhanced genuine image

Scan Results

I have a large number of 35-mm slides dating back over many years and a sizeable collection of 35-mm negative film strips and archiving these into a digital photo library either to an external hard disk or onto DVDs is something I have considered for a long time, but never got around to doing, so the Plustek 7500 Ai seemed just the sort of scan-

ner that would make this task relatively easy, but sadly my experience of scanning my sample slides left me very disappointed and wondering where I had gone wrong, because the scanner and SilverFast software just wouldn't cut the ice with me.


Thinking that I was doing something silly and stupid I consulted the on-line manual and help videos and found I was doing everything by the book, so am puzzled by the abysmal results.

I'll have the 7500Ai set up to demonstrate its capabilities at our February meeting where you can form your own judgment. Meanwhile I'll persevere with more tests and let you know how I get on.

Another fact. When scans are done at a relatively high resolution of say 2400 or 3600dpi (the maximum is 7200), they can take an age. With SilverFast's blemish, dust and scratch remover options turned on it takes the best part of six minutes to scan and process just one 35-mm slide into a saveable image. Add to this the chore of having to re-position each slide manually after each scan, the time taken to scan a collection into digital format will be excessively time consuming. If Plustek should ever get around to designing their next model with an automatic slide feeder they could be on to a winner as an automatic slide-fed scanner would be very attractive to those with a large negative or slide collection that needs digitising.

Availability and Pricing

The 7500i Ai and lower spec 7500i SE are priced at £395 and £223 respectively, excluding VAT and are available now from Jessops.



The same transparency scanned using a bog standard, but very good, Epson Perfection 4990 Photo flat-bed scanner with Epson Scan software colour restorer and Digital Ice scratch and dust remover software turned on the difference is astonishing.

AeroSoft — New Add-ons for Microsoft FSX

One of my favourite suppliers / designers of add-ons for Microsoft's Flight Simulator X (FSX) flight sim program is German company AeroSoft who have just released three FSX compatible add-ons. Aerosoft's PR details below. No time for a review in this issue but one will follow later, before that a hands-on flying demo will take place at one of our club-meets.

By a time consuming process of optimizing SimWings was able to deliver Heathrow to FSX almost as fast as it is on FS2004 (using multi core CPU's of course).

- Airport layout based on official maps representing Heathrow in 2008
- New T 5 buildings, taxiway layout as at October 2008
- Hundreds of taxiway signs and runway details
- AI-Traffic compatible. AFCAD file contains every possible gate. Gates are assigned to specific airlines.
- All docking guidance systems of the real Heathrow airport are rebuilt
- Dynamic scenery. Some static aircraft (low polygon models) as an option





The stylish box sits by your TV and connects up to your home network via WiFi or LAN connection, which not only gives you access to the internet but also allows you to access any music, movies or photos you have on your home computers. Via UPnP you can 'stream' this digital entertainment and display it on your TV.
