Editor's Bit

Welcome Back

When you read this we'll already had the first of our autumn/winter meetings, not entirely as planned as the September 3-D experience didn't work because the 3-D glasses developed a last-minute fault. However not all was lost as we did have a look at the video editing capabilities of the laptop.

Laurence our secretary has been taking notes of our recent meetings and here are his jottings about recent meetings. Regarding the AGM (see below) and comments about a cheaper location for our regular meetings. Despite a couple of suggestions of possible cheaper alternatives, so far we've been unsuccessful in finding anything suitable, so whilst we can we will continue to use our present meeting location.

Secretary's Notes — Recent Meetings

Monday 10th October 2011 - Acer Laptop/ SSD Drive/Dragon Dictate 11.

Tony started off showing a new Acer Aspire Ethos laptop that he had on loan. It wasn't the model that he was promised, with a big screen and Blu-Ray, but it had a second generation i5 (Sandy Bridge) 2.3GHz processor, 8GB of memory and a 750GB hard drive, the case was made of aluminium instead of the usual plastic, and the keys were lit as well. He showed some of

the new restored DVD version of The Sound Of Music, but that really needs a decent speaker system to do it justice.

Next, using the power of the laptop's i5 processor, Tony demonstrated Dragon Naturally Speaking 11.5 Premium, the latest voice to text software from Nuance, costing around £100. You usually have to train the software to recognise your voice, but it seemed to work just as well when Francis had a go with it (and he had never used it before). It can translate the spoken word to text using one of its own programs (Dragon Pad, which is a bit like Word Pad) but you can also use it with Word. You can play back the recording and it will highlight the words as it goes, which makes it easier for you to trap and correct any mistakes.

Finally Tony showed a laptop into which he'd installed a 96GB Kingston SSD as Drive C. As there wasn't time for a full demo of the technique involved in cloning and replacing a normal SATA drive with an SSD one he showed a video he'd made earlier of the processes necessary to change over the drives.

An SSD is very fast (with it Windows 7 boots in just under 15 seconds) but they can be expensive, at around a dollar (or pound) per gigabyte. The 96GB model Tony had costs between £91-£120. You take the 2.5 inch drive out of your laptop and put it into the supplied caddy. You install the solid state drive and then use the supplied Acronis cloning software to

clone the hard drive (plugged in as an external drive) to the SSD. This can take around half a hour, so that's why Tony made the video. He then demonstrated the laptop with the SSD installed, showing how quickly it booted into Windows — just 15-seconds from pressing the start button to a fully working Windows environment — impressively quick.

Monday 12th September 2011 - Sony Vaio 3D Laptop

The first meeting after our summer break started with Tony showing us one of Sony's most expensive (around £1,700) i7 laptops. It can show 3D Blu-ray films and comes supplied with one pair of active-shutter 3D glasses. Unfortunately Tony could not get the display to work, although it was working fine earlier that afternoon!

He went on to show his new Panasonic SDT750 HD camcorder, which uses SDHC cards to record the footage, and comes with a 3D lens adapter. Tony had been to the Proms the other week and had made a short film of his trip. He edited this using Pinnacle Studio 15, importing the footage and adding still photos, music and titles. He went through the steps of creating a video using some footage of his grandchildren swimming in his pool. As with most video editing programs, there are many transition effects available but most professionals only use a simple cut or fade. The only film series I know of that uses a fancy wipe is George Lucas' Star Wars films. If you don't have any music to add to the background of your film, you can use the SmartSound music which is listed by the type and style of music. This creates music 'on the fly' and has the advantage of fitting the length of the clip no matter how low or short it is. If you add another scene to your movie, you can just stretch the music and it will be recomposed to fit.

Picture quality was remarkably high when compared with an earlier DV camcorder's output. The Leica DICOMAR lens is capable of recording near commercial quality videos in MPEG4-AVC/H.264 (AVCHD) formats with a resolution of 1,920 x 1,080p Pixels, the lens has a 12 x Optical Zoom capability and audio can be recorded in Dolby 5.1 format.

Striking results from an impressive camcorder (images on page 3).

Monday 13th June 2011 - AGM and Lexmark Genesis S815 Scanner/Printer

The members of the board gave their reports, and then stood down. All three were re-elected. The subs are to remain at £20, but as the rent for the hall costs £36 per meeting, it was agreed that a cheaper venue (or a renegotiation on the price) really should be found. Anyone with details of a location close to where we meet should send the info to our Chairman/Editor, Tony, at his email address. Laurence reminded members that the website could do with some input from other members, and that the domain was renewed for two years just recently.

Tony then went on to show the Lexmark Genesis S815 Scanner/Printer. This device has a touch screen and instead of a traditional scanner uses a 10 megapixel camera to 'scan' the items in a tray accessed by pulling down the front of the screen. Multiple documents can be printed double sided and magazines can be scanned it they are not too thick. The quality of photos printed were not as good as expected, but this could have been down to the paper used. The printer uses a black and three colour cartridges, which costs £14 each, but Tony could not say how many pages one set of cartridges could print.

Items could be scanned and sent to a PDF or Word (as an RTF file) and the device can be set up to be used wirelessly with its built in WiFi adapter. It also has a


PictBridge connection port, as well as an SD card slot. As the scanning resolution cannot be changed you can't use the scanning functions to enlarge an image but for everyday use it seems easy to use. The

Genesis S815 costs £299 from Lexmark, but only £178 from Amazon.



Corel PaintShop Photo Pro X4 Reviewed

Corel PaintShop Pro X4 has added several new features which I haven't been able to test for myself. The HDR engine (where you take several pictures of the same scene at different exposures, and combine them into one shot) has been changed. Some digital cameras allow you to take photos with different exposures automatically, which would make this feature easy to use, but not mine.

Another new feature is Photo Blend, which allows you to take the best bits from multiple photos of the same scene. Useful if you take a photo but something gets in the way, so you take another one, but the main subject has changed. Probably the best feature of this would be a group photo where someone makes a funny face, so you take another shot and someone else blinks or frowns. You can line up the images and paint the elements you want to remove or keep.

There's a new fill light tool to bring out under exposed areas of your picture, and a selective focus tool which can simulate the tilt-shift lens effect that makes a scene look like a miniature. Whilst this produces an



image which would normally need expensive lens, it has a limited use

When you launch the program it starts up a lot quicker which is a big improvement over the previous version. The program has a been redesigned to have three states, Manage, where you can tag your images and see the contents of folders, Adjust, where you can make small changes to an image, and Edit, the full selection of editing tools.

Manage Mode

The Manage mode only shows two folders to expand. Computer, which lists all of your hard drives and DVD drives and Desktop. Logically the Desktop is part of your computer, so I don't know why it isn't listed under Computer. There is no listing for Network shares or Homegroups, but you can view them if you navigate to the folder in Explorer and right hand click and choose to Browse with Corel PaintShop Pro X4. However, the path is not listed in the folder structure, so if you click on a folder you cannot go back to the Network share. Still, the built-in feature to upload to Flickr or Facebook from the Manage screen was useful.

Edit Mode

When using the Edit mode images do not have their own windows in the workspace.

Images are organised with tabs, which took a bit of getting used to as this is a major change to how the program handles multiple images open at the same time. The interface has changed the colourful icons for the functions at the top to black and white ones. It may fit into the charcoal design of the interface but it makes them less distinguishable. Strangely the effect browser doesn't seem to use the charcoal colours

but the normal colours of the Windows interface, so it looks a little odd.

I don't know whether it was my machine, but I did find a bug where I scanned an image using my scanner, and when I tried to crop the image and entered the dimensions of a crop area larger than the image rather than dragging the crop area, the image became completely white and I had to scan it again.

If you want something that can do any-

thing Photoshop can, but doesn't cost as much (and costs less than Photoshop Elements as well) then this is the software for you. It's not really worth it if you have X3 as the improved start up time and additional features don't add that much to the program. The Ultimate version of the software includes extra filters, some royalty free images and some additional picture tubes. This costs around £17 more that the standard version, which is approximately £50.



AirTies Launches Air 4420-TV

This is a fascinating and in the right circumstances useful piece of kit. What the company says about it is below together with my impressions of it in action.

"AirTies, the innovative wireless networking vendor, today announced the launch of the Air 4420, which allows network-enabled TVs/Players as well as IPTV or Hybrid Sat/Cable/DTT Set Top Boxes to be wirelessly connected to the Internet and home network quickly and safely at the push of a button, enabling the sharing of content like photos, videos and HD video content seamlessly and wirelessly between all network devices.

The Air 4420 wireless devices are installed in pairs, one connected to the IP Gateway and the other to the IPTV set top-box or the Ethernet port of a network enabled TV or Player and – at the press of a button – the two will wirelessly connect the TV or the Player to the Internet as well as into your home network without needing to run unsightly cables. For homes with multiple TVs in upstairs rooms, wireless repeaters can be added to extend the wireless range and their settings will be automatically propagated to all network devices using AirTies' wireless Mesh Technology.

Unlike alternative wireless solutions that suffer from interference, the Air 4420 operates at 5GHz frequency, offering 22 channels for interference free, high speed 300Mbps wireless networking, allowing users to watch High Definition video, listen to music or view photos at high speeds. Link reliability technology guarantees zero packet loss and with AirTies Dynamic Channel Change technology, the device continually monitors for the best channel to deliver the highest quality of service for wireless video or Web TV viewing, ensuring quality of service to the customer with near-zero latency.

The Air 4420 – with the addition of an external USB disk drive - also operates as an UPnP AV compatible media server enabling video, music and photos to be displayed on UPnP AV compatible TVs and Players or served to the entire home network."

If you've got a new TV, it's more than likely to have an Ethernet port built-in allowing it to be connected to your home computer network.

If you do have a such a device do you know how to access video, photos, on demand services like the BBC iPlayer and other features straight from your TV?

For most people a new TV having the potential of being able to do something new and unusual, but not knowing how to make it work properly is a major obstacle, so the new features tends not to be used, or if they

are used, probably not as well as they should be, which is where AirTies comes to the rescue with their Air 4420-TV that lets you wirelessly connect your television to your router without the need for any messy wires trailing around the house.

The box contains two separate mainspowered adaptors with Ethernet ports. When connected the adaptors create their own 802.11n wireless network, thus letting you link two Ethernet devices without resorting to a long cable. It's aimed at TVs and other living-room devices that need to access the Internet.

In practice all that's necessary is to connect one of the devices to your network enabled TV and the other to your router, which if my home set-up is anything to go by will be in another room, and press a button on both. The routers then connect to each other and create a secure WPA connection and bingo! that's it. You can then access all the internet enabled services on your TV such as the BBC's iPlayer plus any of your PC's media content on the network, including video, photos. MP3 files and so on.


As the 4420-TV connects with its wireless N connection at 300Mbps, playback of HD movies is a cinch. On top of that the 4420-TV operates in the 5GHz band so the chances of interference from other household electronic equipment that normally operates in the crowded 2.4GHz band occupied with DECT phones, Microwave ovens etc. etc. is eliminated. However, operating at 5GHz introduces its own problems in that the signals can be severely attenuated when a solid brick wall comes between the 4420 attached to the TV in one room and the 4420 attached to the router in another, but in practice the signal held up well in my house with the router in my study and the TV two rooms away (c. 7-metres), however as the only walls between the two rooms are plasterboard there was no apparent diminution in signal strength which meant I was OK.

Not Just TV

Connection is not restricted to just your TV. As well as the Ethernet connector each of the AirTies adaptors has a built-in USB port for plugging in a USB stick or external hard drive allowing any files on the USB device to be accessed remotely over the network. This means its possible to connect a games console with a USB port to the internet at 300Mbps.

2.4 or 5 GHz Bands

With a little experimentation I discovered that the wireless inside the system works in either the 2.4 or 5 GHz bands using the 802.11 b/g/n protocols. So if you find you have an 'iffy' 5GHz connection it's possible to connect using the

slower 2.4GHz band. If you do decide to use 2.4GHz the AirTies software automatically detects interfering channels and cycles through alternatives until it finds the least crowded network — sweet.

Conclusion

All in all the AirTies 4420-TV is a nifty piece of kit. I had no problems connecting using 5GHz at 300Mpbs and it seemed to do all that was advertised.



In Use

Acronis supplied a downloaded version for me to trial and so far it seems to do what's promised and if you're familiar with the 2011 and 2010 versions a lot more.

Basically as with earlier versions True Image Home can create images of partitions or entire hard drives, or if you only want to protect certain files or folders this can be simply be done too.

Better still if you want instant backup of essential files that you use regularly simply point the program's Nonstop Backup module at the location of these files. I asked it to backup, My Documents and My Pictures folders and True Image monitors these folders backing up new or modified files as they are created or used.

As mentioned in the press release the 2012 version also features online backup via the Acronis True Image Online service. The new Synchronisation tab lets you synchronise your chosen folders with anything from another folder on your PC, to a plugged-in USB external backup drive, or to other computers anywhere, or to a paid-for Acronis True Image Online account.

KISS — (Keep It Simple Stupid)

I'm a great believer in simplicity and my usual backup practice is to do a Regular followed by Incremental backups of my drives 'C' and 'D' which contain my most used and important files. Backups are saved to a dedicated "for backup only" 2TB HD in my computer which makes for seamless and quick backups. Purists will say only backup to an external drive or NAS, and if my business depended on it that's what I'd do, but in a home environment I'm quite content for backups to be made regularly to an internal dedicated HD.

Usability

I much prefer to show the various options etc in graphic form so here's a series of screen grabs showing the various options, so follow on below and overleaf:-

Configuring the backup process is simple (see Fig. 3). It defaults to the basic backup process. If you need more advanced options click on the Disk Backup Options tool.

If things go wrong (see Fig. 5). Recover your backed up files to restore your computer to a working state.

The Tools and Utilities tab brings up a host of useful features:

- Try & Decide allows you to perform a potentially unsafe operations in the Try Mode and Decide whether to apply that action or revert it without damaging your PC
- 2. Clone Disk allows you to copy partitions from one disk to another
- Protection Tools including Rescue Media Builder, Acronis Start-up Recovery Manager and Acronis Secure Zone
- Security and Privacy includes System Cleanup, Acronis Drive Cleanser and File Shredder
- Disk Management tools to add a new disk, view the current state of the hard drive and the new Acronis Extended

- Capacity Manager that allows you to use more than 2 Terabytes even if your OS does not support it
- Backup Conversion allows you to convert an Acronis Backup to a Windows Backup and vice versa
- The Image Mounting utility allows you to access an image as an ordinary disk

Conclusion

Given that 1 and 2TB hard disks are available for a fraction of what they cost just a couple of years ago, there is no excuse for not backing-up your data to one of these, whether using a spare drive-bay in your computer as I do, or to an external hard disk connected via USB or eSATA connectors. The arrival of USB 3 means that data is transferred at ridiculously fast speeds and makes an externally connected hard disk a very viable option for most users.

For a home user True Image Home 2012 does pretty much anything a home user could ask for when it comes to backing up a computer, whether whole disks or simple folders

OK Microsoft Windows Backup which comes free with Windows 7, does many backup tasks and for free, but overall the ease and simplicity of True Image Home 2012, together with the built-in extra tools and utilities, makes it my choice of backup software. It's good, easy and reliable and gets my recommendation.




Fig. 2. Following installation it automatically checks online for updates




Fig. 4. Tools & Utilities — Tabs.




Fig. 6. Disk & Partitions identified by Acronis



Fig. 3. Configure your disk backup process




Fig. 5. Recovery options for when things go wrong



New from Nuance 2 — Dragon Naturally Speaking 11.5 Premium

Talked to by Tony Hawes

I've been using dragon NaturallySpeaking and its predecessors for quite a few years now starting with Lernout & Hauspie, ScanSoft, Dragon Dictate, NaturallySpeaking version 9 and 10 and now version 11.5. So it was interesting to see how version 11.5 performs. But before that here's what Nuance claim for Dragon Naturally Speaking 11.5 Premium:

Installation

Installation is simple put the DVD in your drive, run setup (if it doesn't Auto-Run) and it will then ask a few minor questions as to where it should go and ask whether you want to undertake training. Although it's possible to use Naturally Speaking without training it is strongly recommended that you use the training options so it can assess the quality of the microphone being used, the audio capabilities of your computer, assess the quality of your voice etc. We all speak differently I have a deep voice, a woman talking would have a high-pitched feminine voice, a child using the program would have an even higher pitched voice and unless NaturallySpeaking can assess the various differences of the voice speaking to it, it will not give an accurate transcription of what's been said.

So having installed the program the first thing to do is to run through a brief 10 min or so training routine to assess the quality of your voice and the vocabulary you use. This means reading from a training script, having done this Naturally Speaking is optimised for your voice and speaking style. If others in the family want to use it, it's necessary for them to train it for their voice.

When you open the program Naturally Speaking places its "DragonBar" on the Windows desktop. Here one can turn on and close down the program, turn on and turn off the microphone, although to make it easier the default "turn on the microphone command" is mapped to the Plus (+) key of the Numeric Keyboard. Turning the mic off can be commanded by saying "microphone off", or alternatively clicking on the microphone icon on the top left of the DragonBar.

NaturallySpeaking can be used in most Windows programs: the Desktop, e-mail, Explorer, Microsoft Word etc. and as done here by using Microsoft Word 2010. You can also use it in the supplied DragonPad application which is very similar to Microsoft's WordPad and is the ideal application for short articles or notes, but if you're going to do a long document I would suggest that Microsoft Word is the best place to do the transcription and any subsequent editing.

When you train the program it does offer some odd and similar words like ice cream (to eat), and I scream (to shout). So here's an example of perhaps how it could be tripped up by the vagaries of the English language:

"Professor Smith,

You were right to write me right now regarding my research report. I know that I am slightly behind, but I expect to hand in the paper on chrysanthemum species by the end of the week. Thank you very much."

As you can see it sailed through it admirably choosing write from right in the right context. At the October meeting I showed how well it transcribed a passage from a new book the "Explorers of the Nile." I'll repeat it again just to show that it was no fluke as to how the transcription turned out exactly as written.

"In the middle of the 19th century the whereabouts of the Nile's source was still the planet's most elusive secret, as it had been since the days of the Pharaohs. When Alexander the great was shown the Temple of Ammon in Luxor, the first question he asked is said to have been: "What causes the Nile to rise?" Indeed, a longing to find answers to the twin mysteries of the location of the river's source, and why it always flooded in summer rather than in winter had drawn Alexander to Egypt as powerfully as any military, commercial or political reason. From 30 BC Egypt was ruled by Rome. A Roman proverb ("it would be easier to find the source of the Nile") was still current in 19-century Europe as a handy epitaph to hurl at impractical dreamers of all sorts."

The quote marks and brackets have to be inserted by saying "Open Quote", "Closed Quote" and "Open Brackets" and "Close Brackets". It's not yet clever enough to assess these features, whereas commas and full stops will be inserted automatically depending on your speaking style.

For the slow typist dragon NaturallySpeaking has a lot going for it. It really can cut down the time needed to write a letter or an article such as this for ROM. It's expensive, but can save an enormous amount of time typing out, correcting it and finally saving for insertion in the group newsletter.

With a powerful computer, one can dictate at normal dictation speed and the result is




almost instantaneous transcription. I like it.

Acer Aspire Ethos 5951G

As demonstrated at the October 2011 meeting

Way back in the spring I attended a press event at which Acer computers launched a new range of laptops. I was particularly impressed by and aspire ETHOS laptop with an 18-inch screen, Blu-ray DVD player, Intel core i7 (Sandy Bridge) processor, stacks of RAM and a very large hard disk which looked like an ideal replacement for a desktop. So I immediately put my name down for a review sample when available. In the event it wasn't until the middle of summer that I was told one would be available. Unfortunately my requirements for a review sample that I could show to the group at one of our regular monthly meetings didn't coincide with review samples that Acer had available, I suggested to Acer's PR company that I would like to borrow the review sample so that it could be shown at the October meeting. Unfortunately at the beginning of October I was told that the 18-inch Acer Aspire ETHOS laptop was unavailable and would I like to review and demonstrate the next one down, one with a lesser specification, a much smaller screen and no Blu-Ray player. In the circumstances I said yes, the smaller 15.6 inches screen laptop with an Intel core i5 Sandy Bridge processor with a good NVIDIA graphics card would be fine.

When it arrived I was impressed. Although it didn't have all the bells and whis-

tles that would have come with the 18-inch screen model, it was still pretty impressive. Initial impressions were very good, it looked high-quality with its stylish black, brushed metal finish metal casing, it came with a numeric keyboard a useful feature when using a spreadsheet, a fingerprint scanner with biometric password management/logins. A Crystal Eye HD webcam that can be used for Skype conversations is at the top of the screen.

Backlit Keyboard

One of the more useful features was that the keyboard keys that stood proud of the keyboard base. The keyboard is backlit, being illuminated from underneath, a useful feature if you need to type in semi darkness. In use the keys were firm making for

easy keyboard typing.

Alongside the left screen hinge are three keys/buttons:

- A programmable key, the default setting being to start the launch manager which allows the key to be programmed
- 2. Opens Windows Media Center.
- 3. Turns on the keyboard backlight control.

Touchpad

The touchpad is not like the usual touchpad at all, it's removable, slide a switch underneath it on the front of the laptop and it slips out, and can be used as a remote control with the supplied Clear-Fi software. As well as the normal keypad movements controlled by your finger there are two dedicated areas on the

touchpad to control your videos or music, but in use operating the touchpad as a remote is limited. It's a good idea that needs more development. The touchpad has its own built-in rechargeable batteries that are recharged when the touchpad sits in its cradle in front of the keyboard. When out of the cradle it communicates by via a Bluetooth connection.

Audio

Audio wise it has built in Dolby 5.1 speakers, but in my opinion this is a vastly over-hyped feature as they are nothing like a cinema-style loudspeaker setup; they are adequate but not terribly impressive. However, connect external speakers and the Dolby 5.1 features come into their own.

Screen

The other disappointment was the 15.6" 16:9 HD LCD screen. It was too glossy and suffered badly from reflections. At the beginning of the month when it was unseasonably sunny and warm, I thought I'd do some work on my garden terrace, but despite turning the screen brightness up to maximum, the brightness of the reflections off the screen made it almost impossible to work, it's nothing like a good Matt surface screen similar to my existing Acer laptop which I can use quite happily in the brightest sunlight, but again one small qualification. If you are going to work in a darkened room the screen is more than adequate.

For a screen of this size the resolution at only 1366 x 768 pixels is way too low. This was particularly noticeable if one wanted to play a DVD movie, the movie lost its sparkle, and if we go back to the Sony 17-inch VAIO laptop that we saw in September

with its gorgeous real full-HD screen, the Acer loses points. As was noticed at our demo in October, there was some stuttering when playing back a new DVD, not a Bluray DVD, (it doesn't have a Blu-Ray player), but a bog standard shop bought, albeit high quality DVD, the digitally remastered version of the 1960's hit "The Sound of Music").

Input / Output Connectors

This laptop comes with a good selection of input/output connectors, including a connection for the latest USB 3.0 protocol, also noticeable was that it came with a FireWire port; many laptops nowadays have ceased including these, which for users like me who likes to download video from a relatively old (six years old) DV camcorder, makes for a real bonus feature.

Other connectors include another USB port, but this time USB 2.0; HDMI connector, eSATA, VGA, Ethernet, and the usual selection of headphone, microphone, and audio-in sockets. Interestingly the headphone socket doubles as an SP/DIF optical port to connect the Ethos to an external 5.1 surround sound system and finally there's an SD card slot on the front to download your photos or videos from a camera or camcorder SD card.

Bundled Software

I haven't used a recent Acer laptop and was surprised at the number of bundled applications supplied with it, including Microsoft Office 2010 Starter, Windows Live Essentials 2011, McAfee Security Suite, Clear.fi DLNA media sharing software (if I'd known in time this would have been a perfect chance to see how well this feature worked with the Air Ties set up

reviewed on page 7). NTI's Media Maker for DVD authoring and the GameZone console with a selection of casual games. You have to make your own decision as to whether these are worth keeping, I tried Microsoft Office 2010 Starter which I hadn't seen before and was fairly impressed, it is basic, but worked like a better version of WordPad, but I think some of these programs just occupy space unnecessarily and should be removed once you are happy with how the laptop is performing.

Conclusion

Like the curates egg, the Aspire Ethos 5951G is good in parts. On the whole it performed very respectively as a desktop replacement; the removable touchpad which I initially thought was a bit of a gimmick turned out to be quite useful. The 750 GB hard disk, 8 MB of RAM, and dedicated NVIDIA graphics card shows that this is a powerful machine and not to be sneezed at. However, I was disappointed with the shiny and relatively low resolution screen and disappointed that the DVD stuttered occasionally when playing some DVDs (as was commented on by the audience at the Group meeting in October). Others may think the laptop is absolutely ideal as a desktop replacement.

Shortly before this issue of ROM went to press Seagate's PR company were in touch with me about testing one of their new Solid State Hybrid drives. So far I've only got their PR to work from, but expect to have a review sample for testing shortly that I'll be demonstrating at the February 2012 meeting.

Here's what their PR says.



When wil VHF/FM be Replaced by DAB?

An interesting concept, but wide-spread adoption of DAB will only happen if and when the main FM stations are turned off.

For some inexplicable reason back in early 2009 Lord Carter's review of digital broadcasting advocated, without asking any member of the public whether they wanted it or

not, that DAB would be introduced to replace FM Radio. Radio chiefs were dead keen on the idea; so the then Labour Government made a diktat that by 2015, VHF/FM broadcasts would be switched off, but luckily for consumers the outgoing Labour Government was not able to put the 2015 date into its Digital Economy Act, which was rushed through during its last days of power in April 2010.

But the new Coalition government had second thoughts and downgraded this to 'an aspiration' declaring that a switchover would not happen 'until the vast majority of listeners have voluntarily adopted digital radio and until digital coverage matches FM.'

The rethink came after it was revealed millions of motorists will be forced to spend hundreds of pounds replacing or converting their car radios with new digital sets and new equipment at home an example of planned obsolescence on a massive scale

The current target is that the switch off will only happen when 50% of listeners listen digitally, at the moment just 28% do so. So a long time to go to switch-over, if at all.


